SPECIAL WASTEWATER DISCHARGE FORM INSTRUCTION SHEET

Metropolitan Sewer District of Greater Cincinnati (MSD) allow for facilities to discharge special wastewater not covered under a pretreatment permit. This application allows the facility to discharge approved compatible liquid wastes on a short term basis. Failure to comply with the registration process may be a violation of Article XV of the Metropolitan Sewer District Rules and Regulations and may subject the violator to enforcement action. Below you will find instructions for completing the registration form.

- 1. Please complete the Special Wastewater Discharge form.
- 2. Answer all questions carefully. If there is doubt about the appropriate response to a question, write "unsure" or "information not available." In some cases, the questions may be answered by a simple check mark.
- 3. The General Information section of the form asks about the requester, the property owner and the location of the wastewater discharge.
- 4. The Basic Facility Information section asks about the purpose of the application and the basic facility operations that are present at the facility. (These may or may not be related to the discharge.) Please fill in all applicable information about your facility and enclose a copy of your most recent water bill.
- 5. The Proposed Wastewater Discharge Characterization section of the form inquires about the types of wastes that will be discharged. MSD may require sampling of the wastewater before or during the discharge. There may also be limits on the times and amounts of discharge allowed based on sewer conditions. Please check all that apply.
- 6. Please refer to the Frequently Asked Questions (FAQ) for additional information, and a copy of the form, on-line at www.msdgc.org, "Customer Care", under the "Industrial User Resources" page or scan the QR code at the top of this page.
- 7. The base charge for a One Time Discharge (OTD) permit, as of 2021, is \$390 for a discharge volume of up to 50,000 gallons. Additional charges apply for each gallon above the base discharge volume of 50,000 gallons. The permit fee and other applicable fees may increase annually. The "Your Sewer Bill" page under "Customer Care", has helpful information regarding billing.

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DEFINITIONS

"Authorized" or "Duly Authorized Representative" of the User.

- (1) If the User is a corporation:
 - a. The president, secretary, treasurer, or a vice-president of the corporation in charge of a principal business function, or any other person who performs similar policy or decision-making functions for the corporation; or
 - b. The manager of one or more manufacturing, production, or operating facilities, provided the manager is authorized to make management decisions that govern the operation of the regulated facility including having the explicit or implicit duty of making major capital investment recommendations, and initiate and direct other comprehensive measures to assure long-term environmental compliance with environmental laws and regulations; can ensure that the necessary systems are established. or actions taken to gather complete and accurate information for individual wastewater or general discharge permit requirements; and where authority to sign documents has been assigned or delegated to the manager in accordance with corporate procedures.
- (2) If the User is a partnership or sole proprietorship: a general partner or proprietor, respectively.
- (3) If the User is a Federal, State, or local governmental facility: a director or highest official appointed or designated to oversee the operation and performance of the activities of the government facility, or their designee.
- (4) The individuals described in paragraphs 1 through 3, above, may designate a Duly Authorized Representative if the authorization is in writing, the authorization specifies the individual or position responsible for the overall operation of the facility from which the discharge originates or having overall responsibility for environmental matters for the company, and the written authorization is submitted to the District.

Combined Sewer - shall mean a sewer that is intended to serve as a storm sewer and a sanitary sewer

Compatible Pollutant - shall mean: biochemical oxygen demand, suspended solids, pH, and fecal coliform bacteria plus additional pollutants identified by the Director if the treatment works, in fact, does remove such pollutants to a substantial degree. The term substantial degree is not subject to precise definition, but generally contemplates removals in the order of 80 percent or greater. Minor incidental removals in the order of Hi to 30 percent are not considered substantial. Examples of the additional pollutants that may be considered compatible include:

- Chemical oxygen demand
- Total organic carbon
- Phosphorus and phosphorus compounds
- Nitrogen and nitrogen compounds
 Fats, oils and greases of animal or vegetable origin (except as prohibited where these materials would interfere with the operation of the wastewater treatment works.)

Commercial User - shall mean any and all users of the wastewater treatment system not otherwise classified.

Industrial User - shall be any user that discharges industrial waste.

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DEFINITIONS

- Pollutant Dredged spoil, solid waste, incinerator residue, filter backwash, sewage, garbage, sewage sludge, munitions, Medical Wastes, chemical wastes, biological materials, radioactive materials, heat, wrecked or discarded equipment, rock, sand, cellar dirt, municipal, agricultural and industrial wastes, and certain characteristics of wastewater (e.g., pH, temperature, TSS, turbidity, color, BOD, COD, toxicity, or odor).
- Pollution shall mean an alteration of the quality of the Water of the State by waste to a degree that affects such waters for beneficial use or facilities that serve such beneficial uses. Pollution may include contamination
- Publicly Owned Treatment Works (POTW) shall mean the same as "Wastewater Treatment System" ("WTS"). A treatment works, as defined by section 212 of the Act (33 U.S.C. section 1292), which is owned by the Control Authority. This definition includes any devices or systems used in the collection, storage, treatment, recycling, and reclamation of sewage or industrial wastes of a liquid nature and any conveyances, which convey wastewater to a treatment plant.
- Pretreatment The reduction of the amount of pollutants, the elimination of pollutants, or the alteration of the nature of pollutant properties in wastewater prior to, or in lieu of, introducing such pollutants into the POTW. This reduction or alteration can be obtained by physical, chemical, or biological processes; by process changes; or by other means, except by diluting the concentration of the pollutants unless allowed by an applicable Pretreatment Standard.
- Pretreatment Requirements Any substantive or procedural requirement related to pretreatment imposed on a User, other than a Pretreatment Standard.

Residential User - shall mean any single or two-family housing unit.

- Sanitary Sewer shall mean a sewer that carries sanitary sewage and industrial wastes and to which storm, surface and groundwater are not intentionally admitted.
- Sewer shall mean any pipe or conduit for conveying wastewater or drainage water.
- Storm Sewer or Storm Drain shall mean a sewer which carries storm waters, surface runoff, street wash waters and drainage, foundation drains, ground water, roof runoff, subsoil drains, subsurface drainage, swimming pool water, but which excludes sanitary sewage and industrial wastes, other than unpolluted cooling water and unpolluted industrial process water.
- Stormwater Any flow occurring during or following any form of natural precipitation, and resulting from such precipitation, including snowmelt.
- User shall mean any person that discharges, causes, or permits the discharge of wastewater into a public sewer.
- Wastewater shall mean a combination of the liquid and water-carried wastes from premises together with any groundwater, surface water, or storm water that may be present.

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
